


Did you know?

My pet has soft brown fur, and four feet.




This is how a Sixth Grader expresses his feelings in a new school:

What do you know about H1N1?


H1N1 is also known as Swine Flu. It is called Swine Flu because in the past, the people who caught it had direct contact with pigs, and another name for a pig is swine! When infected people cough or sneeze, the virus spreads in the air. If you come in contact with the virus, touch a surface (like a doorknob or sink) around the cough or sneeze, or touch something an infected person recently touched, you can catch H1N1! So be careful!

-Mars is smaller and has less mass than Earth. As a result, it has less gravity. If you weigh 100 pounds on Earth, you would weigh 38 pounds on Mars.
